To repeal and reenact Section 17-14-70, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the division of the state into congressional districts, so as to redistrict the state's congressional districts based upon the 2020 federal census.

Section 17-14-70 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is repealed.

Section 17-14-70 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§17-14-70.
