24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. (a) In Dale County, effective beginning
26	with the general election in November 2012 and every four
27	years thereafter, the Chair of the Dale County Commission

shall be elected from the county at large. The first term of the chair after the general election in 2012 shall commence at the conclusion of the term of the judge of probate serving on the effective date of this act. Thereafter, the judge of probate shall no longer serve as chair of the county commission. The first chair elected from the county at large shall serve until a successor is elected and qualified. Succeeding terms of the chair of the county commission shall commence in November at the same time the term of the county commission commences as provided by general law. The chair of the county commission shall thereafter serve for a term of four years and shall serve until a successor is elected and qualified. The chair of the county commission shall be a resident and qualified elector of the county. The chair of the county commission shall serve full time and shall receive a salary in the amount of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) per year payable in equal monthly installments. In addition, the chair shall receive a monthly expense allowance in the amount of three hundred dollars (\$300) per month and the same travel expenses and health insurance benefits payable to other members of the county commission. The chair shall preside at all meetings of the commission, but may designate another member of the commission to serve as chair in his or her absence.

(b) This section shall not affect the salary of the Judge of Probate of Dale County during the term of the judge which ends on January 20, 2013. Effective beginning the next

term of office, the judge of probate shall receive the salary
provided by law.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed. Act 1955 of the 1971 Regular Session (Acts 1971, p. 3174) and Act 87-661 of the 1987 Regular Session (Acts 1987, p. 1169), are expressly repealed.

Section 3. Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall become operative only if approved by a majority of the qualified electors of Dale County who vote in an election to be held on the date of the general election in 2010. The notice of the election shall be given by the judge of probate, and the election shall be held, conducted, and the results canvassed in the manner as other county elections. The question shall be, "Do you favor the adoption of Act No. , of the 2010 Regular Session of the Alabama Legislature providing for the election of the Chair of the Dale County Commission from the county at large and providing that the judge of probate of the county will no longer serve as chair of the commission? Yes () No ()." The county shall pay any costs and expenses not otherwise reimbursed by a governmental agency which are incidental to the election. If a majority of the votes cast in the election are "Yes," Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall become operative immediately. If the majority of the votes are "No," this act shall be repealed and shall have no further effect. The Judge of Probate of Dale County shall certify the results of the election to the Secretary of State.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
