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8	SYNOPSIS:	The Prepaid Affordable College Tuition
9		program which was enacted in 1989 has provided an
10		opportunity for the purchase of PACT contracts to
11		provide for future college tuition payments to be
12		made. The program has provided these payments for
13		each year since inception. The PACT Board has
14		suspended new entrants into the program and has
15		expressed concerns about the ability to meet the
16		contractual obligations for those participants
17		still in the program. Since the PACT program was
18		enacted by the Legislature and the PACT Board is an
19		agency of the state, the payment of contractual
20		obligations of this state agency is an issue that
21		should be addressed by this Legislature. This bill
22		will provide for the funding to offset any
23		shortfall if the assets of the program are
24		insufficient to meet the obligations.

1	AN	ACT
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To provide for additional funds to be appropriated from the Education Trust Fund to the Prepaid Affordable College Tuition program under certain conditions until there are sufficient funds to meet the future obligations for existing PACT contracts and to repeal Section 16-33c-9 Code of Alabama 1975 as amended relating to the disposition of funds upon the dissolution of the PACT Program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Definitions:

APSCA -- The Alabama Public School and College
Authority, a corporation authorized by Section 16-16-3 Code of
Alabama 1975 as amended to issue bonds for educational
purposes in Alabama.

Base Year Debt Service -- The debt service for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013 for bonds issued by the APSCA which are paid from certain tax receipts which accrue to the Education Trust Fund. This amount for Fiscal Year 2013 according to the current debt service schedule is \$189,515,980.00.

Current Debt Service Schedule -- The schedules for debt service for bonds issued by the APSCA as such schedules existed on January 1, 2010. It does not include any additional payments which might be due to any refinanced bonds or additional bonds issued after January 1, 2010 which are to be repaid from a tax source which accrues to the Education Trust

Fund. It also does not include the debt service for any bonds described under Section 16-16-14 Code of Alabama 1975 as amended and commonly referred to as "pool bonds."

PACT Program -- The Prepaid Affordable College
Tuition program established under Section 16-33c-6 Code of
Alabama 1975 as amended whereby purchasers enter into
contracts for the future payment of tuition and mandatory fees
at eligible educational institutions. The PACT program
includes the PACT Trust Fund which is the source of payments
of the obligations of the PACT program under the PACT
contracts.

Section 2. The Legislature hereby declares that the PACT program which is administered by an agency created by the Legislature has been a successful program providing a valuable service for those individuals trying to prepare for future higher educational expenses. However, the PACT Trust Fund may have insufficient assets to meet all future obligations. Since the obligations of the PACT program were authorized by statute, those obligations should be honored by the State of Alabama.

September 30, 2014 there is hereby annually appropriated from the Education Trust Fund to the PACT Trust Fund an amount equal to the difference between APSCA base year debt service and the APSCA debt service for the then current fiscal year. If the difference between the base year debt service and the then current fiscal year debt service is less than zero then

no appropriation shall be made. These funds shall be invested by the PACT Board and used to meet tuition and fee obligations of the PACT Trust Fund. The appropriations shall continue from year to year until the PACT fund has sufficient assets to meet all of the obligations for existing PACT contracts only. The PACT board shall not reopen the program for new participants and no funds appropriated herein may be used for contracts not in existence on the effective date of this act.

Section 4. The PACT Board shall continue to provide for an annual audit of the assets and obligations of the PACT fund. In any year in which the actuarial audit of the PACT fund demonstrates that the assets are sufficient to fund the remaining benefits obligations, the PACT Board shall issue a certification to the Legislature stating that sufficient assets are in the fund and that additional appropriations are no longer required. Upon the receipt of the certification the appropriation requirement in Section 2 above shall terminate for any subsequent fiscal year. Any funds in the PACT Trust Fund remaining after the payment of all of the obligations of the fund shall be transferred to the Education Trust Fund in the fiscal year immediately following the year in which the last obligations are met.

Section 5. Section 16-33c-9 Code of Alabama 1975 is hereby repealed.

Section 6. The provisions of this act are severable.

If any part of this act is declared invalid or

- unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part
 which remains.
