24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. (a) Any veteran who has been certified by
26	the United States Department of Veterans' Affairs or any
27	branch of the United States Armed Forces as a one-hundred

percent, service-connected, permanently and totally disabled 1 veteran and who has been a bona fide resident of the state for 2 not less than six months next preceding the date of 3 4 application may procure a special disabled veteran's hunting license in the following manner: The applicant shall file, in 5 the county in which he or she resides, with the person who is 6 7 duly authorized to issue licenses stating his or her age, place of residence, post office address, and length of 8 9 residence in this state. The application shall have attached a 10 copy of satisfactory proof from the United States Department of Veterans' Affairs or any branch of the United States Armed 11 12 Forces stating that the applicant is one-hundred percent, 13 service connected, permanently and totally disabled.

(b) The hunting licenses issued pursuant to this
section shall be valid on a continuous basis for veterans
showing proof of one-hundred percent, service-connected,
permanent and total disability.

18 (c) The licenses pursuant to this section shall not19 be issued by special agents.

20 (d) The issuing officer shall be allowed a one
21 dollar (\$1) issuance fee for the issuance of the licenses.

(e) The licenses issued pursuant to this section
shall be in lieu of the annual resident hunting licenses
provided in Section 9-11-44, Code of Alabama 1975, but shall
not supplant any additional license or requirement to hunt on
a state-operated wildlife management area, as provided in
Section 9-11-45, Code of Alabama 1975, or to hunt migratory

1 waterfowl in this state, as provided in Section 9-11-433, Code 2 of Alabama 1975.

3 (f) The commissioner may adopt reasonable rules
4 necessary for the implementation and administration of this
5 section.

6 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 7 first day of the third month following its passage and 8 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
