10 TO BE ENTITLED
11 AN ACT
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13 Relating to Macon County; to amend Section 16 of Act
14 97-663, 1997 Regular Session (Acts 1997, p. 1272); to allow a
15 member of the county commission to direct a crew to maintain
16 unpaved roads.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

18 Section 1. Section 16 of Act 97-663, 1997 Regular
19 Session (Acts 1997, p. 1272), is amended to read as follows:

20 "Section 16. Each member of the county commission
21 shall inspect the roads and bridges of his or her district
22 from time to time. The members of the county commission shall
23 also assist in securing right-of-way and assist in public
24 relations generally. Each member of the county commission may
25 elect to direct a crew to maintain the unpaved roads in his or
26 her district and to address the complaints and concerns of the
27 citizens of his or her district. The personnel and equipment

1 for any such crew shall be determined by the county commission
2 in session, and the expenses for any crew shall come out of
3 the overall budget for the construction, maintenance, and
4 repairs of the county roads, bridges, and ferries of Macon
5 County. Any commissioner electing to direct a crew will be the
6 custodian and accountable to the county commission for all
7 road machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, and repair parts
8 owned by Macon County and used by his or her crew. The county
9 commission shall establish necessary policies and regulations
10 governing accountability for the county owned equipment.
11 Request for requisitions for all materials, machinery,
12 equipment, and supplies necessary for the operation of any
13 crew shall be routed through the county engineer, or presented
14 to the commission in session."

15 Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
16 with this act are repealed.

17 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
18 first day of the third month following its passage and
19 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
