9		personnel vacancies are required to be posted at
10		public K-12 schools and postsecondary education

12		This bill would require the posting of
13		notices of vacancies in the positions of State

15		superintendent of education, appointed city
16		superintendent of education, Chancellor of

24		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
25		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
26		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of

Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general

law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

Relating to public education; to amend Sections 16-9-11, 16-12-1, and 16-60-111.1, Code of Alabama 1975; to add Sections 16-4-1.1 and 16-60-111.9 to the Code of Alabama 1975; to require the posting of notices of vacancies in the positions of State Superintendent of Education, appointed county superintendent of education, appointed city

superintendent of education, Chancellor of Postsecondary 1 2 Education, and the chief executive officer of any two-year school or college under the auspices of the State Board of 3 Education, the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the Alabama School of Fine Arts, the Department of Youth Services 5 6 School District, and the Alabama High School of Mathematics 7 and Science; and in connection therewith to have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 8 expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 9 10 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as 11 Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the 12 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. 13

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. Section 16-4-1.1 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

- (a) Notice of a vacancy in the position of State Superintendent of Education shall be posted by the State Board of Education. The notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place at each school campus and worksite, including all state and local board of education offices, at least 30 calendar days before the position is to be filled. The notice shall remain posted until the position is filled and shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, all of the following:
 - (1) Job description and title.
 - (2) Required qualifications.
 - (3) Salary amount.
 - (4) Information on where to submit an application.

- 1 (5) Information on any deadlines for applying.
- 2 (6) Any other relevant information.
- (b) The State Board of Education may adopt or 3 continue policies which are not inconsistent with this section. The position shall not be filled during the required 5 6 posting period, except as herein provided. The posting of a 7 vacancy notice as required in this section shall not be abridged or delayed except in emergency circumstances and then 8 delayed only temporarily in order to reasonably meet the 9 10 conditions of the emergency. Violation of the notice 11 requirements of this section shall void any related employment 12 action taken by the board.
 - (c) A vacancy in the position of State

 Superintendent of Education shall be filled by the State Board of Education within 120 days after the vacancy occurs. The board may temporarily fill the position on an interim basis for not more than six months.
 - Section 2. Sections 16-9-11, 16-12-1, and 16-60-111.1 of the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

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- "(a) A vacancy in the office position of county
 superintendent shall be filled by the county board of
 education within 90 120 days after such a vacancy occurs.
- "(b) In the event such vacancy is not filled by the county board of education within 90 120 days, the state superintendent shall fill such vacancy by appointment. The

appointee shall hold office for the unexpired term. "Term," as used in this section, includes, in addition to those terms the beginning and ending of which are fixed definitely by the law, terms fixed by the county board of education, in which latter case the unexpired term shall be the balance of the term fixed for the last person serving as such officer; provided, that when. When there is such vacancy which the state superintendent is authorized to fill, and no term has been fixed by the county board of education, and no term of definite duration is fixed by law, the appointee of the State Superintendent of Education shall serve two years from the next succeeding first day of July.

"(c) Notice of a vacancy in the position of an appointed county superintendent of education shall be posted by the county board of education. The notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place at each school campus and worksite at least 30 calendar days before the position is to be filled. The notice shall remain posted until the position is filled and shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, all of the following:

- "(1) Job description and title.
- "(2) Required qualifications.
- "(3) Salary range.

- "(4) Information on where to submit an application.

"(d) A vacancy in the position of Chancellor shall be filled by the state board within 180 days after such a vacancy occurs. The board may temporarily fill the position on an interim basis for not more than six months."

Section 3. Section 16-60-111.9 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

- (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
- (1) BOARD. The Board of Trustees of the Alabama
 Institute for Deaf and Blind; the Alabama Youth Services
 Department School Board in its capacity as the Board of
 Education for the Youth Services School District; the Board of
 Directors of the Alabama School of Fine Arts; the Board of
 Trustees of the Alabama High School of Mathematics and
 Science; and the State Board of Education as applied to
 two-year postsecondary education institutions.
- (2) EXECUTIVE OFFICER. The President of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind; the president of any two-year

- school or college under the auspices of the State Board of

 Education; the Executive Director of the Alabama School of

 Fine Arts; the Superintendent of the Department of Youth

 Services School District; and the Executive Director of the

 Alabama High School of Mathematics and Science.
 - (b) Notice of a vacancy in the position of executive officer shall be posted by the applicable board. The notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place at each school campus and worksite at least 30 calendar days before the position is to be filled. The notice shall remain posted until the position is filled and shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, all of the following:
 - (1) Job description and title.
 - (2) Required qualifications.
 - (3) Salary range.

- (4) Information on where to submit an application.
- (5) Information on any deadlines for applying.
- (6) Any other relevant information.
- (c) The board may adopt or continue policies which are not inconsistent with this section. The position shall not be filled during the required posting period, except as herein provided. The posting of a vacancy notice as required in this section shall not be abridged or delayed except in emergency circumstances and then delayed only temporarily in order to reasonably meet the conditions of the emergency. The adoption of additional policies shall comply with the requirements and procedures of Section 16-1-30.

(d) A vacancy in the position of executive officer

shall be filled by the board within 120 days after such

vacancy occurs. The board may temporarily fill the position on

an interim basis for not more than six months. Experience

gained by employment on a temporary interim or emergency basis

may not be applied toward job experience requirements.

(e) Violation of the notice requirements of this section shall void any related employment action taken by the board.

Section 4. The requirements of this act shall not apply to any search underway on the effective date of this act.

Section 5. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill requires expenditures only by a school board.

Section 6. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
