25 WHEREAS, part of the broader British strategy in the 26 War of 1812, the Creek War was intended to set up a "neutral"

state to stifle American expansion; Jackson's forces

August 9, 1814, ended the Creek War; and

1 effectively eliminated that threat to our fledgling nation;
2 and

3 WHEREAS, his victory in the Battle of Horseshoe 4 Bend, along with his subsequent notoriety as a result of his 5 later victory in the Battle of New Orleans, is widely regarded 6 as having generated for General Jackson the popular affection 7 necessary to ascend to the Presidency; and

8 WHEREAS, it is the sense of this body that the 2014 9 bicentennial anniversary of the Battle of Horseshoe Bend and 10 the signing of the Treaty of Fort Jackson specifically meets 11 the criteria set by the Committee for commemoration; now 12 therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we urge the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee of the United States Postal Service to recommend a stamp commemorating the 2014 bicentennial anniversary of the Battle of Horseshoe Bend and the signing of the Treaty of Fort Jackson.
