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8 CREATING THE JOINT INTERIM LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON 9 OPEN MEETINGS LEGISLATION.

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Joint Interim Legislative Committee on Open Meetings Legislation is created. The committee shall be composed of three members of each house, to be appointed by the presiding officer of each house. The membership of the committee shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban and rural, and economic diversity of the state. The committee shall report to the Legislature by the 2nd legislative day of the 2011 regular session the extent to which the committee has complied with the diversity provisions provided for in this resolution. The chair and vice chair of the committee shall be elected at the first meeting by the members of the committee, which shall be held not later than 10 days after the effective date of this resolution. The committee shall meet no more than four times following the initial meeting of the committee. The committee shall study all facets of Alabama's Open Meetings Law, to

include the drafting of a new or revised Act that will allow for meetings of public boards and agencies by teleconference.

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Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the committee. The committee shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations, including delivery of the new proposed legislation, as agreed upon and authored by the committee, to the Legislature not later than the 5th legislative day of the 2011 Regular Session, whereupon the committee shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities. Each member of the committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the committee. Upon requisitions signed by the chair of the committee, these payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state business. The total expenditures of the committee shall not exceed \$5,000.
