11	WHEREAS, it is a privilege to recognize and commend
12	Freddie H.E. Jones, II, for organizing a special ceremony to
13	honor our Vietnam Veterans on April 30, 2010, in Birmingham,
14	Alabama; and
15	WHEREAS, although it has been 37 years since the
16	Vietnam Veterans served the cause of justice in Southeast
17	Asia, their commitment and dedication continues to deserve the
18	highest praise; and
19	WHEREAS, in 2007, the United States Congress, by
20	separate Senate and House Resolutions, declared that a Welcome
21	Home Vietnam Veterans Day should be established; and
22	WHEREAS, Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day is
23	observed in many states each year, recognizing the
24	contributions and honoring the sacrifices of our valiant
25	veterans;

1 WHEREAS, the Vietnam War was fought in Vietnam from 2 1961 to 1975, and involved North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in conflict with the United States and South Vietnam; and 3 4 WHEREAS, in 1965, there were 80,000 United States troops in Vietnam, and by 1969, a peak of approximately 5 6 543,000 troops was reached; and 7 WHEREAS, on January 27, 1973, the Treaty of Paris was signed, which required the release of all United States 8 prisoners of war held in North Vietnam and the withdrawal of 9 10 all United States Armed Forces from South Vietnam; and WHEREAS, on March 30, 1973, the United States Armed 11 12 Forces completed the withdrawal of combat troops from Vietnam; 13 and 14 WHEREAS, more than 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces lost their lives in Vietnam and more than 15 16 300,000 were wounded; and 17 WHEREAS, some 1,200 members from Alabama were mortally wounded while countless others were injured; for each 18 of those 1,200 members, there are family members and friends 19 20 around the state and the nation whose suffering knows no 21 bounds; and 22 WHEREAS, the citizens of the State of Alabama owe 23 never-ending gratitude to our soldiers in Vietnam who 24 courageously defended American freedoms against ruthless 25 enemies, yet no amount of gratitude can adequately compensate 26 these patriots for their pain, suffering, and disruption to

their lives; and

WHEREAS, we welcome the Vietnam Veterans to our communities as people who love this county and who have put their lives at stake for freedom and democracy for all, and their service should never be forgotten; now therefore,
