26 Sigma Theta presently boasts over 900 chapters around the

1 WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Theta's principal purpose is to

4 development, educational development, international awareness
5 and involvement, physical and mental health, and political
6 awareness and involvement; and

8 its nearly 100 years of service to and activism in the
9 community; now therefore,
