10	WHEREAS, Eugene B. Sledge, a native of Mobile,
11	joined the United States Marines in 1943 and served our
12	country with courage and patriotism with the First Marine
13	Division during the horrific battles of Peleliu and Okinawa;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, he later compiled written notes and
16	recollections into a memoir of his military service for his
17	family in a 300-page book, "With the Old Breed: at Peleliu and
18	Okinawa," which was published in 1981; the book sold hundreds
19	of thousands of copies and led to numerous editions; and
20	WHEREAS, "With the Old Breed" is now regarded as one
21	of the foremost books in American literature about the
22	experience of war and is recognized as a unique account of the
23	life of an ordinary fighting soldier; and
24	WHEREAS, Dr. Sledge's second book, "China Marine,"
25	published in 2002 after his death, provides a powerful and
26	thoughtful account of American troops in their immediate
27	post-War occupation experience, as well as describing the

1 struggles of young soldiers who had lived through such 2 hardship and violence returning to the everyday world of their fellow Americans; and 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Sledge's work was a core element in the highly regarded Ken Burns series on World War II and is now 5 6 being used as partial source material in a miniseries on Home 7 Box Office; the series, "The Pacific," tracks the intertwined real-life stories of three Marines, including Dr. Sledge, 8 across the Pacific Theater of World War II; and 9 10 WHEREAS, after leaving the military, Dr. Sledge 11 earned a Ph.D. in biology and served as a worthy role model 12 for his students as a professor at the University of Montevallo for more than 28 years, where he held firmly to the 13 14 conviction that education is the key to success for our nation's youth; and 15 WHEREAS, as an avid bird-watcher, Dr. Sledge was 16 17 motivated by the love of the outdoors and spoke to numerous civic and professional organizations, as well as wrote columns 18 for various magazines, about birds and bird-watching; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Dr. Sledge's memory is cherished by 21 thousands of Alabamians, including the members of this body, 22 who honor his service to the United States of America and to 23 the youth of the State of Alabama; now therefore,
