24	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
25	(a) No privilege or license tax on the gross
26	receipts of any natural person derived from the conduct of a

1 vocation, occupation, calling, or profession may be levied in 2 Morgan County. (b) Nothing in this amendment is intended to repeal 3 or affect the current authority granted by local act to Morgan County to impose business licenses or the current authority 5 6 granted to municipalities to impose municipal business 7 licenses, including those imposed pursuant to Sections 11-51-90, 11-51-91, 11-51-92, and 11-51-93, Code of Alabama 8 1975. 9 10 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the 11 12 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 13 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 14 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 15 state. Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 16 17 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 18 following description of the substance or subject matter of 19 the proposed constitutional amendment: 20 21 "Relating to Morgan County, proposing an amendment 22 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to prohibit the 23 imposition of an occupational tax. "Proposed by Act _____." 24 This description shall be followed by the following 25 26 language: "Yes () No ()."
