4	To amend Sections 9-13-221, 9-13-222, and 9-13-223,

8	offenses for which a law enforcement officer may seize motor
9	vehicles and other equipment; and to provide for delivery of
10	the equipment to the regional forester of the forestry region

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. Sections 9-13-221, 9-13-222, and
14	9-13-223, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as
15	follows:

17	"It shall be the duty of any sheriff, policeman,
18	forestry officer, or other peace officer or law enforcement
19	officer in the State of Alabama, arresting any person who is
20	charged with violating or attempting to violate <u>Section</u>
21	9-13-60 or any felony theft laws of the State of Alabama,
22	wherein timber or lumber are items stolen involving timber or
23	forest products or transactions pertaining thereto, to seize
24	any vehicle and equipment used, which is in the possession or

Forestry Commission) of the forestry district regional forester of the forestry region in which the arrest is made. The person receiving any vehicle and equipment from the arresting officer shall keep it in a safe place and in as good condition as when received, until disposed of as hereinafter provided. The seizure of vehicles and equipment provided in this section is authorized only when the arrest is for a crime involving the theft of timber harvesting equipment or the parts thereof, the harvesting, removal, transportation, or disposal of any forest products, or any other transactions related to forest products or timber harvesting equipment or any part or parts from timber harvesting equipment.

"Within five days after the arrest of any person for violating Section 9-13-60 or any of such felony theft laws of the State of Alabama outlined in this article, the person receiving possession of any vehicle and equipment, seized as aforesaid, shall report the seizure and detention of said the vehicle and equipment to the district attorney or other prosecuting official, giving a full description of such vehicle and equipment, any identification number, make and model thereof, the name of the person in whose possession it was found when seized, the person, if any, making claim to same or any interest therein if the name can be ascertained or is known, and the date and place of such the seizure and a statement of the circumstances surrounding the seizing of the property.

"Within five days after the final conviction of any person for violating Section 9-13-60 or any of such felony theft laws of the State of Alabama wherein timber or lumber were items stolen, or intended to be stolen, involving timber or forest products or transactions pertaining thereto, the person receiving possession of any vehicle and equipment, seized as aforesaid, shall report the seizure and detention of said the vehicle and equipment to the district attorney or other prosecuting official, giving a full description of such vehicle and equipment, any identification number, make and model thereof, the name of the person in whose possession it was found when seized, the person, if any, making claim to same or any interest therein if the name can be ascertained or is known, and the date and place of such seizure and a statement of the circumstances surrounding the seizing of the property."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
