20	Section 1. Section 1 of Act No. 79-501, 1979 Regular
21	Session (Acts 1979, p. 914), as last amended by Act 2008-95,
22	2008 Regular Session (Acts 2008, p. 126), is further amended
23	to read as follows:
24	"Section 1. Upon receipt by Limestone County of
25	funds pursuant to Title 40, Chapter 28 of the Code of Alabama
26	1975, (Acts No. 92 of the 1978 Alabama Legislature, approved
27	August 7, 1978, 1978 Acts of Alabama, Page 1787), as amended,

- 1 Limestone County will within a reasonable time thereafter,
- 2 distribute the funds so received as follows:

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- "(a) Effective through September 30, 2006, all funds shall be distributed as prescribed by this section as amended by Act 86-550, 1986 Regular Session.
 - "(b) Effective October 1, 2007, and thereafter, the funds shall be distributed as follows:
- "(1) Before the percentage formula of distribution 8 contained in a later portion of this act is applied, the 9 10 following amounts shall be distributed in the following manner: Forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to Auburn University 11 12 to be used exclusively for the benefit of the Limestone County 13 Cooperative Extension Service, seven thousand five hundred 14 dollars (\$7,500) to the Limestone County Soil and Water 15 Conservation District, fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to the 16 Athens, Limestone County Development Association, 17 Incorporated, seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to the Athens Branch of the Wheeler Basin Regional Library (Athens 18 Public Library), five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to the Houston 19 Memorial Library, twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) to the 20 21 Veteran's Museum and Archives, twelve thousand dollars 22 (\$12,000) to each of the 13 volunteer fire departments in the county in existence on January 1, 2006, twelve thousand 23 24 dollars (\$12,000) to the Athens-Limestone County Rescue Squad, 25 fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to Athens State University 26 for capital improvements or program enhancements, twenty-five 27 thousand dollars (\$25,000) to the Limestone County Family

Resource Center, and five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to the
Limestone County Recycling Center.

"(2) After the allocations as set forth in subdivision (1) has been completed, the remainder of all funds received by Limestone County pursuant to Title 40, Chapter 28 of the Code of Alabama 1975 (Act 92 of the 1978 Alabama Legislature), is to be distributed as follows: Limestone County General Fund, 25 percent; Limestone County Public Building Fund, 10 percent; Special Hospital Tax Fund, five percent; Countywide School Fund, 23.5 percent; School District 1, nine percent; School District 2, six percent; City of Athens, 20 percent; City of Ardmore, one percent; City of Elkmont, .38 percent; City of Mooresville, .06 percent; City of Lester, .06 percent.

"(3) Effective with the fiscal year beginning
October 1, 2007, the three percent increase in the
in-lieu-of-taxes payments generated by Act 2006-655, 2006
Regular Session, to counties served by the Tennessee Valley
Authority shall be distributed separate and apart from the
distribution in subdivisions (1) and (2) above and shall be
distributed to the county commission to be used for economic
development, public service, and community projects in the
county.

"(4) Effective with the fiscal year beginning
October 1, 2010, any increase in the in-lieu-of-taxes payments
generated by Act 2010-135, 2010 Regular Session, to counties
served by the Tennessee Valley Authority shall be distributed

separate and apart from the distribution in subdivisions (1),

(2), and (3) above and shall be distributed to the county

commission to be used for economic development, public

service, and community projects in the county."

Section 2. This act shall become effective

immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
