20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:	
21	Section 1. Section 13A-7-23.1, Code of Alabama 1975	
22	is amended to read as follows:

24	"(a) Any person who willfully or maliciously	
25	injures, defaces, removes, or destroys any tomb, monument,	
26	gravestone or other memorial of the dead, or any fence or any	
27	inclosure about any tomb, monument, gravestone or memorial,	

burial mound, earthen or shell monument containing human 1 skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, or other 2 structure or thing placed or designed for a memorial of the 3 dead, or any fence, railing, curb, or any enclosure for the protection or ornamentation of any tomb, monument, gravestone, burial mound, earthen or shell monument containing human 6 7 skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, or other structure before mentioned, or for any enclosure for the 8 burial of the dead, or any person who willfully and wrongfully or maliciously destroys, removes, cuts, breaks, or injures any tree, shrub, plant, flower, decoration, or other real or 11 12 personal property within any cemetery or graveyard shall be 13 quilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

"(b) Any person who willfully or maliciously desecrates, injures, defaces, removes, or destroys any tomb, monument, structure, or container of human remains, burial mound, earthen or shell monument containing human skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, and invades or mutilates the human corpse or remains shall be quilty of a Class C felony and upon conviction the person shall be punished as provided by law. Any person who maliciously desecrates an American Indian place of burial or funerary objects on property not owned by the person shall be quilty of a Class C felony and upon conviction the person shall be punished as provided by law.

"(c) The provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section shall not apply to any person holding a permit

issued by the Alabama Historical Commission pursuant to

subsection (d) of this section, to anyone operating a cemetery

under standard rules and regulations and maintenance

procedures, or to any person otherwise authorized by law to

remove or disturb a tomb, monument, grave marker, burial

mound, earthen or shell monument, or similar structure, or its

contents, as described in subsections (a) and (b).

"(d) The Alabama Historical Commission, to provide for the lawful preservation, investigation, restoration, or relocation of human burial remains, human skeletal remains, or funerary objects, shall promulgate rules and regulations for the issuance of a permit and may issue a permit to persons or companies who seek to restore, preserve, or relocate human burial remains, human skeletal remains, funerary objects, or otherwise disturb, a place of burial."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
