9		defacement of certain memorials of a deceased
10		person is a crime.
11		This bill would provide further for the type
12		of memorial by including a burial mound or certain
13		other burial structures and would provide an
14		exemption for certain cemetery operators and others
15		authorized to remove a memorial.
16		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
17		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
18		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
19		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
20		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
21		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
22		becoming effective with regard to a local
23		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
24		unless: it comes within one of a number of
25		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
26		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

1 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 2 the entity for the purpose. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 3 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 5 the bill does not require approval of a local 6 7 governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the 8 specified exceptions contained in the amendment. 9 10 11 A BILL 12 TO BE ENTITLED 13 AN ACT 14 To amend Section 13A-7-23.1, Code of Alabama 1975, 15 relating to the crime of desecration or defacement of certain 16 17 memorials and to provide exemptions; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement 18 of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the 19 meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 20 21 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official 22 Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as 23 amended. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 24 25 Section 1. Section 13A-7-23.1, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 26 "\$13A-7-23.1.

"(a) Any person who willfully or maliciously injures, defaces, removes, or destroys any tomb, monument, gravestone or other memorial of the dead, or any fence or any inclosure about any tomb, monument, gravestone or memorial, burial mound, earthen or shell monument containing human skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, or other structure or thing placed or designed for a memorial of the dead, or any fence, railing, curb, or any enclosure for the protection or ornamentation of any tomb, monument, gravestone, burial mound, earthen or shell monument containing human skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, or other structure before mentioned, or for any enclosure for the burial of the dead, or any person who willfully and wrongfully or maliciously destroys, removes, cuts, breaks, or injures any tree, shrub, plant, flower, decoration, or other real or personal property within any cemetery or graveyard shall be quilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

"(b) Any person who willfully or maliciously desecrates, injures, defaces, removes, or destroys any tomb, monument, structure, or container of human remains, <u>burial</u> mound, earthen or shell monument containing human skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, and invades or mutilates the human corpse or remains shall be guilty of a Class C felony and upon conviction the person shall be punished as provided by law. Any person who maliciously desecrates an American Indian place of burial or funerary objects on property not owned by the person shall be guilty of

a Class C felony and upon conviction the person shall be punished as provided by law.

"(c) The provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section shall not apply to any person holding a permit issued by the Alabama Historical Commission pursuant to subsection (d) of this section, to anyone operating a cemetery under standard rules and regulations and maintenance procedures, or to any person otherwise authorized by law to remove or disturb a tomb, monument, grave marker, burial mound, earthen or shell monument, or similar structure, or its contents, as described in subsections (a) and (b).

"(d) The Alabama Historical Commission, to provide for the lawful preservation, investigation, restoration, or relocation of human burial remains, human skeletal remains, or funerary objects, shall promulgate rules and regulations for the issuance of a permit and may issue a permit to persons or companies who seek to restore, preserve, or relocate human burial remains, human skeletal remains, funerary objects, or otherwise disturb, a place of burial."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
