Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no law enforcement agency, law enforcement officer, or other entity shall impose an accident response service fee on or from an insurance company, the driver or owner of a motor vehicle, or any other person or entity.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
