20	To amend Section 31-2-13, Code of Alabama 1975, to
21	grant a military leave of absence for members of the civilian
22	auxiliary of the United States Air Force known as the Civil
23	Air Patrol.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 31-2-13, Code of Alabama 1975, is
26	amended to read as follows:
27	"§31-2-13.

1 "(a) Military leave of absence. - All officers and 2 employees of the State of Alabama, or of any county, municipality, or other agency or political subdivision 3 thereof, or officers or employees of any public or private business or industry who are active members of the Alabama 5 6 National Guard, Naval Militia, the Alabama State Guard 7 organized in lieu of the National Guard, the civilian auxiliary of the United States Air Force known as the Civil 8 Air Patrol, or of any other reserve component of the armed 9 10 forces of the United States, shall be entitled to military leave of absence from their respective civil duties and 11 12 occupations on all days that they are engaged in field or 13 coast defense or other training or on other service ordered under the National Defense Act, or of the federal laws 14 governing the United States reserves, without loss of pay, 15 time, efficiency rating, annual vacation, or sick leave. 16 17 Notwithstanding the foregoing, no person granted a leave of absence with pay shall be paid for more than 168 working hours 18 per calendar year, and those persons shall be entitled, in 19 addition thereto, to be paid for no more than 168 working 20 21 hours at any one time while called by the Governor to duty in 22 the active service of the state. This section shall apply to 23 all schools and institutions of learning supported by state 24 funds.

"(b) Credit for active federal service. - Service in the National Guard or Naval Militia of Alabama, when called, drafted, or ordered into the service of the United States,

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shall be considered as equivalent service in the Alabama

National Guard or Naval Militia for any and all state purposes

regarding privileges, honors, pay, allowances, and exemptions

provided by law for members of the National Guard and Naval

Militia of Alabama."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the

first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
