13	WHEREAS, Mayor Edward Daniel, former mayor of the
14	City of Marion, by petition, is heralded by city officials and
15	his fellow citizens for his contributions to the City of
16	Marion; and
17	WHEREAS, Mayor Daniel has spent most of his life
18	serving the people of the City of Marion and Perry County; he
19	began a teaching career at Marion Baptist Academy in 1959; he
20	later coached at Lincoln High School, now Francis Marion High
21	School, continuing a coaching career to become head basketball
22	coach, and coach of football, basketball, and track and field;
23	eventually he was named Athletics Director of Francis Marion
24	High School in 1987; and
25	WHEREAS, after 35 years of teaching and coaching, in
26	1994, he retired from the Perry County School System and

during the same year, was inducted into the Alabama High

School Athletic Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Daniel began his political career in the early 1970's, when upon the request of the late Mayor Douglas Moore, he was appointed to the Marion Industrial Development Board and The Marion Recreation Board; he served as a youth supervisor in the City of Marion under the CETA Summer Youth Employment Program, receiving recognition for his leadership in 1982 from Governor Fob James as he was named the state's "Outstanding Worksite Supervisor" for youth employment programs; and

WHEREAS, he continued his political career by becoming Marion's first African American elected official, serving on the Marion City Council, and then in 1992, Mayor Daniel's political career was solidified as he was elected the first African American Mayor of Marion, serving 3 terms in office; and

WHEREAS, his 20 years of service to the City of
Marion as an elected official brought about numerous grants to
the city, including a grant to renovate the Old Depot which
now houses the Perry County Chamber of Commerce; his other
grant projects included water system improvement and
construction of The Georgia Walker Walking Trail; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Daniel continues a life of service on the Board of Deacons at Trinity Baptist Church, as Sunday School teacher for young men, as the Vice-Chairman of Perry County's "Sowing Seeds of Hope" organization, as a member of

1 the Perry County Chamber of Commerce, and as a member of the 2 Perry County Rural Development Committee; his past affiliations include, The Alabama League of Municipalities 3 Executive Committee, The National Conference of Mayors, serving on the Board, The Alabama Conference of Black Mayors, 5 6 serving as president, and The World Conference of Mayors, also 7 serving as president; and WHEREAS, because of Mayor Edward Daniel's many years 8 of service, leadership, and dedication to the City of Marion 9 10 and Perry County, we desire to permanently and officially 11 honor his contributions; now therefore, 12 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 13 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That a 4.5 mile portion of Alabama 14 Highway 5, between the northern and southern city limits of 15 Marion, is hereby designated the "Edward Daniel Highway."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be provided to Mayor Edward Daniel as an expression of our appreciation for his service.
