BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we urge any solid waste transportation and disposal service, whether public or private, which picks up solid waste from a residence to provide educational information to its customers at least once per quarter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we hereby direct the Department of Public Health to display and make available materials educating the public about the safe disposal of home generated medical sharps in all county public health departments throughout the state.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we hereby direct the Department of Environmental Management to collaborate with licensed medical waste collectors to educate the public or disseminate information through the Department's medical waste program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we urge the Home Health Care Association of Alabama to make these materials available

to all members of the Association and encourage annual 1 distribution to clients. 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we urge the American 3 4 Diabetes Association of Alabama to make these materials 5 available to all members annually. 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we urge each entity 7 named in this resolution to make a copy of these materials available on its website in order to inform all Alabamians 8 9 about the dangers of disposing of sharps in medical waste. 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we hereby ask and 11 encourage the foregoing entities to complete the foregoing
