116725-1:n:01/20/2010:CAJ/mfp LRS2010-442 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 SUPPORTING FEDERAL RULES TO REGULATE TAX PREPARERS. 9 10 WHEREAS, in 2009 the Alabama State Senate passed a 11 law to regulate tax preparers in Alabama; and 12 WHEREAS, the Alabama Taxpayer Protection and 13 Assistance Act, if it had been enacted, would have required 14 tax preparers to be certified and licensed in this state; and 15 WHEREAS, there are currently no educational 16 qualifications, no training standards, and no licensing 17 requirements that must be met to become a paid tax preparer in 18 Alabama; and 19 WHEREAS, the Federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) 20 was established by Congress in 1975 for low-wage, working 21 individuals and families as a refundable tax credit designed 22 to encourage people to get and keep their jobs; and 23 WHEREAS, it is estimated that in 2008, \$133 million 24 in earned income tax credit dollars went undistributed to 25 Alabama families because these families sought help from tax

preparers who were not qualified to advise them on this
 important tax credit; and

WHEREAS, studies in Alabama indicate that unlicensed tax preparers prey on low-wage workers by charging high prices to prepare the returns and based on anticipated refunds, offer them loans with oppressive rates of interest as much as 800 percent; and

8 WHEREAS, too often returns are filed with mistakes 9 that cause hard working individuals to go through an audit, 10 leaving those who can least afford it to clean up the mess of 11 the unregulated tax preparers; and

12 WHEREAS, the reforms passed by the Alabama State 13 Senate would have helped ensure that taxpayers receive 14 competent, accountable, and ethical services from qualified 15 trained professionals; and

16 WHEREAS, following the lead of states like Alabama 17 on this initiative, the federal government has announced that 18 for the first time, tax preparers will be required to register 19 with the federal government; and

20 WHEREAS, the federal government will now require a 21 large percentage of tax preparers to pass competency tests and 22 take annual continuing education courses; and

23 WHEREAS, the changes will be implemented for the 24 2011 tax season, ensuring that as taxpayers turn to tax 25 preparers for help, the citizens of this state and this country will be represented by competent advocates; now
 therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 3 4 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we express our support for the 5 new rules set forth by the federal guidelines related to the 6 registration, testing, and education of tax preparers. The 7 guidelines represent a monumental shift in the regulation of 8 tax return preparers, which will ensure that the hard working 9 people of this great state and country are protected when they 10 file their annual returns.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution, on behalf of the State of Alabama and its citizens, be forwarded to the Alabama Congressional Delegation and President Barack Obama commending their work on this important initiative.
