13 Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, on the observance of
14 Delta Day, Thursday, April 1, 2010, at the Alabama State

17 by 22 collegiate women at Howard University, Delta Sigma Theta
18 Sorority now has grown to a membership of more than 250,000
19 women, predominantly Black and college-educated, in more than
20 960 chapters throughout the United States and abroad; and

22 national Five Point Program: Economic Development, Educational
23 Development, International Awareness and Involvement, Physical
24 and Mental Health, and Political Awareness and Involvement;
