16	WHEREAS, Alabama educators must comply with standard
17	practices and ethical conduct toward students, professional
18	colleagues, school officials, parents, and members of the
19	community; and
20	WHEREAS, in maintaining the dignity of the
21	profession, Alabama educators must respect and obey the law,
22	demonstrate personal integrity, and exemplify honesty; and
23	WHEREAS, Alabama educators are in positions of
24	public trust and must act accordingly; and
25	WHEREAS, the State Department of Education filed a
26	"Notice of Intended Action" of a proposed amendment to Rule

290-4-1, entitled "Education Accountability," which notice was 1 2 published in the May 2009 Alabama Administrative Monthly; and 3 WHEREAS, the State Department of Education certified 4 to the Legislative Reference Service the adoption by the State Board of Education of the proposed rule on July 14, 2009, 5 6 which was the subject of review at a meeting of the Joint 7 Committee on Administrative Regulation Review on August 12, 2009; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Alabama Legislature supports an Alabama 10

Educator Code of Ethics requiring educators to adhere to a high ethical standard; and

WHEREAS, after hearing from interested persons, the Joint Committee determined the proposed rule was ambiguous and incapable of being enforced as currently drafted, and, in accordance with Section 41-22-23, Code of Alabama 1975, disapproved the proposed rule change and proposed a revised rule to be adopted by the board and to be known as the Alabama Educator Code of Ethics; and

WHEREAS, the revised rule defined the professional behavior for Alabama educators and set forth standards for ethical conduct and clearly defined unethical conduct resulting in disciplinary sanctions; and

WHEREAS, the revised rule proposed by the Joint Committee would give Alabama one of the toughest codes of ethics for teachers in the nation; and

WHEREAS, the State Board of Education refused to accept the recommended amendment and resubmit the revised rule while continuing to support an ambiguous and unenforceable rule; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That because the State Board of Education refused to accept the proposed amendment and resubmit the revised rule proposed by the Joint Committee, the decision of the Joint Committee to disapprove the proposed amendment to Rule 290-4-1, entitled "Education Accountability," is sustained.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature recommends the Department of Education and the State Board of Education reconsider the proposed amendment and revised rule suggested by the Joint Committee on August 12, 2009, to be entitled the Alabama Educator Code of Ethics, which will give Alabama one of the toughest codes of ethics for teachers in the nation.
