(c) On presentation of a document pursuant to this section, a photocopy of the document shall be placed in the file of the student and the document that is presented shall be returned.

- (d) On the failure of a person enrolling a student or instructing a child at home or through a church school to comply with this section, the school or local superintendent of education shall notify the person in writing that, unless he or she complies within 10 days, the case shall be referred to the local law enforcement agency for investigation. If compliance is not obtained within the 10-day period, the school or local superintendent of education shall refer the case to the local law enforcement agency and notify the State Department of Education.
- (e) The school or local superintendent of education shall immediately report to the local law enforcement agency and the State Department of Education any affidavit received pursuant to this section that appears inaccurate or suspicious in form or content.
- (f) Within five school days after enrolling a transfer student from a private school or another school district, a school shall request directly from the previous school a certified copy of the record of the student. The requesting school shall exercise due diligence in obtaining the copy of the record requested. Notwithstanding any financial debt owed by the student, any school requested to forward a copy of the record of a transferring student to a

new school pursuant to this subsection shall comply and
forward the record within 10 school days after receipt of the
request.

(g) Any disclosure of educational records by a
school district shall comply with the federal Family
Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.

Section 2. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
