Beaver 12 traps are not required to have the license number 13 of the owner on the taq. This bill would delete the use of plastic 14 15 tags on traps and delete the requirement that the 16 license number of the owner of a trap be contained 17 on any tag. 18 19 A BILL 20 TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 21 22 To amend Section 9-11-59 of the Code of Alabama 23 24 1975, relating to licensing of persons for the trapping of fur-bearing animals, to further provide for the tags used to 25 26 identify traps being used for trapping. 27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 9-11-59 of the Code of Alabama
1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§9-11-59.

4 "(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to take, capture, or kill, or to attempt to take, capture, or kill for 5 6 commercial purposes by any means or device any of the 7 fur-bearing animals protected by the laws or regulations of this state without first procuring a license therefor, to be 8 issued in the same manner as is provided for hunting and 9 10 fishing licenses. Any person who has been a bona fide resident 11 of this state for six months next preceding may procure a 12 resident trapping license by paying the sum of \$7.65. Any 13 person who has not been a bona fide resident of this state for 14 six months next preceding may procure a nonresident trapping license by paying the sum of \$500.15. Any resident or 15 nonresident when trapping for beaver only shall not be 16 17 required to pay a license fee. A trapping license shall be valid only during the season when fur-bearing animals may be 18 legally taken. 19

"(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to trap in 20 21 the State of Alabama without identifying each trap with a 22 plastic or metal tag bearing the license number, name, and 23 address of the owner; provided, however, that traps used solely for beaver shall be identified in a like manner, but 24 25 the tag shall bear only the name and address of the owner. 26 Should any law enforcement officer of this state or employee 27 of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources of the

State of Alabama discover any trapping device being used in violation of the terms of this section, he or she the officer shall confiscate the device and it shall become the property of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and shall be disposed of as ordered by the Commissioner of Conservation and Natural Resources.

7 "(c) A violation of this section or failure to fully 8 comply therewith shall constitute a misdemeanor and, upon 9 conviction, the person violating same or failing to comply 10 therewith shall be punished by a fine of not less than two 11 hundred fifty dollars (\$250) nor more than two thousand 12 dollars (\$2,000) for each offense."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
