23	To reopen the Teachers' Retirement System and the
24	Employees' Retirement System for purchase of certain prior
25	service credit in the system by an active and contributing
26	member who was employed as an employee with the United States
27	Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Any active and contributing member of the Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees' Retirement System who has 10 years or more of credible service in either system may claim and purchase service credit in the system for prior service for employment as an employee with the United States Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency if the employment occurred between August 1, 1987, and February 28, 1998, and if the member complies with the conditions prescribed in subsection (b). No member shall receive credit for any service that the member is already credited with in the system or any other public retirement plan, with the exception of the federal Social Security program.

(b) Any member who is eligible to purchase service credit pursuant to subsection (a) shall pay to the Secretary-Treasurer of the system, within one year from the effective date of this act, the full actuarially determined cost for each year of claimed service as determined by the system's actuary.

Section 2. Any year of service purchased under the provisions of this act shall not be considered in determining the out-of-pocket premium amount charged to retirees under the provisions of Section 16-25A-8.1 or Section 36-29-19.7, Code of Alabama 1975. Also, any service purchased under this act shall not entitle a member to be eligible for benefits under either the Public Education Employees' Health Insurance Plan or the State Employees' Health Insurance Plan any earlier than

the member could have reached eligibility under the plan
without the service purchased under the provisions of this
act.

Section 3. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
