 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama
Athletic Commission.

Section 2. The existence and functioning of the
Alabama Athletic Commission, created and functioning pursuant
to Sections 41-9-1020 to 41-9-1040, inclusive, Code of Alabama
1975, is continued, and those code sections are expressly
preserved.

Section 3. The Legislature concurs in the recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections 1 and 2 of this act.

Section 4. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
with this act are repealed. Specifically, Sections 41-9-90.1
and 41-9-96, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the State
Athletic Commission, inactive since inception.

Section 5. This act shall become effective
immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or
its otherwise becoming law.
