- (c) The State Health Officer shall promulgate any rules necessary to carry out this act pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act.
- (d) A person who violates this section, or rules the State Health Officer has promulgated pursuant to this section, is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500). The Attorney General shall enforce this act and may petition the Circuit Court of Montgomery County for injunctive relief to prevent a person from violating this section.
- (e) For the purposes of this section, "child's new reusable food or beverage container" means a new receptacle for storing food or beverage that is designed or intended by a manufacturer to be used by an individual five years of age or younger, including, but not limited to, baby bottles, spill-proof cups, sports bottles, and thermoses. Child's new reusable food or beverage container does not mean a used food or beverage container or a food or beverage container intended for disposal after initial use.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
