- (1) A light which is carried on the person of a hunter, affixed to a helmet or hat worn by a hunter, or part of a belt system worn by a hunter.
 - (2) A bow or gun that has a light source attached that is capable of casting a beam of light, such as a laser sight, forward of the bow or gun.
 - (3) Equipment that uses electronics to increase the ability to see in the dark, such as night vision equipment.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
