25		becoming effective with regard to a local
26		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote

unless: it comes within one of a number of

specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

Relating to firearms; to provide for the crime of soliciting, persuading, encouraging, or enticing a licensed dealer or private seller of firearms to transfer a firearm or ammunition under circumstances which a person knows violates the laws of this state or the United States; to provide for the crime of providing a licensed dealer or private seller of firearms or ammunition with false information with the intent to deceive the dealer or seller about the legality of the transfer of a firearm or ammunition; to provide penalties and exceptions; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased

- Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this act, the following words have the following meanings:
- 8 (1) AMMUNITION. Any cartridge, shell, or projectile designed for use in a firearm.
 - (2) LICENSED DEALER. A person who is licensed pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 923 or Section 13A-11-79, Code of Alabama 1975, to engage in the business of dealing in firearms.
- 14 (3) MATERIALLY FALSE INFORMATION. Information that
 15 portrays an illegal transaction as legal or a legal
 16 transaction as illegal.
 - (4) PRIVATE SELLER. A person who sells or offers for sale any firearm, as defined in Section 13A-8-1(4), Code of Alabama 1975, or ammunition.
 - (b) A person who knowingly solicits, persuades, encourages, or entices a licensed dealer or private seller of a firearm or ammunition to transfer a firearm or ammunition under circumstances which the person knows would violate the laws of this state or the United States is guilty of a Class C felony.
 - (c) A person who provides to a licensed dealer or private seller of firearms or ammunition what the person knows

to be materially false information with intent to deceive the dealer or seller about the legality of the transfer of a firearm or ammunition is guilty of a Class C felony.

(d) This section does not apply to a peace officer acting in his or her official capacity or to a person acting at the direction of a peace officer.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
