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8	SYNOPSIS: This bill would exempt a tax-exempt entity
9	operating a dental clinic from the Dental Practice
10	Act, but would require the entity to register with
11	the State Board of Dental Examiners and to have a
12	licensed dentist serving as chief of staff. This

14	of the clinic to otherwise comply with the dental
15	licensing law.

22	to exempt certain tax-exempt entities operating dental clinics
23	from the Dental Practice Act; to require the entities to

26	comply with the dental licensing law.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 34-9-7.2 is added to the Code of
Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

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§34-9-7.2.

A tax-exempt entity, as defined under Section 4 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, that operates a dental 5 6 clinic that provides dental services shall be exempt from this 7 chapter. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the tax exempt entity shall register with the board. A copy of the entity's 8 501(c)(3) certification from the Internal Revenue Service 9 10 shall be filed with the board. If the entity has multiple clinics, the entity shall register each clinic with the board 11 12 and shall have a licensed dentist serving as chief of dental 13 services for the clinics. All dentists and hygienists at each 14 clinic shall possess the applicable licenses or permits 15 required by this chapter and shall be subject to this chapter.

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
