This bill would also provide for the annual evaluation of the operation of each charter school and the submission of a compilation of the evaluations to the Governor and the Legislature.

AN ACT

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Program Act of 2011; to provide for the creation and operation of independent public charter schools in the state through existing public school systems; to provide a mechanism for local boards of education to authorize the establishment of charter schools; to require the State Board of Education to design a petition for establishing or continuing a charter school; to require submission and review of a petition by the local board of education; to specify the elements required for the continued operation of a charter school; to provide a procedure for a local board of education to determine whether

to grant or deny a petition; to specify reasons for the revocation of a charter; to authorize a local board of education to provide transportation to charter school students; to permit the participation of charter school employees in the Retirement Systems of Alabama and the Public Education Employees Health Insurance Program; to provide for the annual evaluation of charter schools; and to require annual reporting by the State Board of Education to the Governor and the Legislature.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Alabama Charter School Pilot Program Act of 2011

Section 2. It is the intent of the Legislature to provide an alternative means within the public school system for ensuring accomplishment of the necessary outcomes of education by offering opportunities for school building or school system employees, groups, educational services contractors, and other persons or entities to establish and maintain charter schools that operate within a school system structure, but independently of other schools within the system.

Section 3. For the purposes of this act, the term charter school is a separate and distinct form of public school, attendance at which is voluntary, which is established to accomplish one or more of the purposes provided by this act. A charter school may be maintained in a separate facility or in an existing school facility if the charter school is

1 operated separately from any other school in the shared facility. Each charter school shall offer a general curriculum appropriate to the grade levels offered at the charter school, 3 and may include one or more special programs as a part of its curriculum. A charter school may also be organized around a special emphasis, theme, or concept or may utilize innovative 6 7 educational methods or practices, or any combination of these.

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Section 4. A local board of education, individually or jointly with any other local board of education, may authorize the establishment of a nonsectarian charter school as a means of providing new opportunities in accomplishing all of the following:

- (1) Improved student learning.
- (2) Increased instructional opportunities for students in special areas of emphasis in accord with the theme established for the charter school.
- (3) Creative and unconventional instructional techniques and structures.
- (4) New professional vistas for teachers who operate such schools or who choose to work in such schools.
- (5) Freedom from conventional program constraints and mandates.

Section 5. (a) The State Board of Education shall design and prescribe the format of a petition for the establishment of a charter school. The petition shall be designed in a manner that provides for the inclusion of a description of the key elements of the charter under which the school is to be operated. A local board of education may adopt policies and procedures for receiving, reviewing, and screening petitions.

- (b) A petition for the establishment of a charter school may be prepared and submitted, by or on behalf of a school building or school system employee group, an educational services contractor, or any other person or entity, to the local board of education. The petition shall be submitted by not later than December 1 of the school year preceding the school year in which the charter school is proposed to be established.
- (c) The local board of education shall receive and review each petition for establishment or continuation of a charter school and may grant or renew a charter for operation of a charter school. The charter shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following elements:
- (1) A description of the educational program of the charter school, including a description of any physical facilities to be used by the program.
- (2) A description of the level of interest and support expressed by school system employees, parents, and the community.
- (3) Specification of program goals and measurable student outcomes consistent with achieving those goals.
- (4) An explanation of how student performance in achieving the specified outcomes is to be measured, evaluated, and reported.

1 (5) The governance structure of the school,
2 including the means of ensuring accountability to the local
3 board of education.

- (6) A description of qualifications required to be satisfied by any person employed by the school system who requests assignment to the charter school.
- 7 (7) Procedures to be followed to ensure the health 8 and safety of students and staff.
 - (8) Criteria for the admission of students including, but not limited to, a description of a random selection method to be used if too many students seek enrollment in the school.
 - (9) The manner in which annual financial and program audits shall be conducted.
 - (10) Student suspension and expulsion policies, to the extent there is any deviation from policies adopted by the local school board.
 - (11) The manner in which students shall participation in the Alabama assessment program.
 - (12) The terms and conditions of employment by the charter school.
 - of employment and the status of certificated employees of the system who participate in the operation of the school shall be handled upon nonrenewal or revocation of the charter or upon a decision by such employee to discontinue participation in the operation of the charter school.

1 (14) The proposed budget of the charter school
2 including, but not limited to, an estimate of any federal
3 funds that may be received and how such funds shall be used.

- (15) A description of how the budget shall be funded if federal funds are not available.
 - (d) In addition to satisfying the local board of education of those elements listed in subsection (c), to qualify for establishment or continuation, a charter school shall also satisfy all of the following requirements:
 - (1) The school shall be focused on outcomes or results.
 - (2) Students enrolled in the school shall be reasonably reflective of the racial and socioeconomic composition of the school system as a whole.
 - (3) Students may not be charged tuition.
 - (4) Compliance with applicable health, safety, and access laws shall be assured.
 - (5) The school shall show efforts to serve the special education population, as appropriate.
 - (e) If, upon receipt of a petition for the establishment or continuation of a charter school, a local board of education finds the petition to be incomplete, the board may request that the petitioner provide any information necessary to make the petition complete. After receiving a complete petition, the local board of education shall give notice of the time, date, and place for the holding of a

public hearing on the petition and shall rule on the petition within 30 days after the public hearing.

- shall send a notification of denial to the petitioner specifying, in writing, the reasons for the denial. A copy of the notification shall also be submitted to the State Board of Education. Within 30 days after the date of the notification of denial, the petitioner may submit a request to the local board for reconsideration of the petition and may submit an amended petition with the request. The board shall act on the request for reconsideration within 30 days after receipt of the request.
 - (2) If the local board of education approves the petition, the board shall notify the petitioner and the State Board of Education within 30 days after the approval, or by February 1 of the school year preceding the school year in which the charter school is proposed to be established, whichever is earlier.
 - (f) Any provision of this act to the contrary notwithstanding, any law or rule relating to public K-12 education is waived for a charter school unless specifically included in the charter school contract by the authorizing local board of education.

Section 6. (a) If a charter school has been approved for establishment or continuation by the local board of education, no additional approval shall be required for a period of five school years. The local board of education may

either renew the charter and continue operation of the school,

or nonrenew the charter and discontinue operation of the

school.

- (b) Renewal of the operational status of a charter school shall be approved only if the charter school has demonstrated progress in achieving the program goals originally established by the charter school. The local board of education shall first determine whether the charter school is demonstrating such progress.
- (c) The local board of education shall revoke the charter of a school if the charter school does any of the following:
- (1) Materially violates any provision of the charter.
 - (2) Fails to make progress in achieving the program goals contained in the charter.
 - (3) Fails to comply with the fiscal accountability procedures specified in the charter.
 - (4) Violates any rule of the State Board of Education that has not been waived by the State Board of Education.
 - (5) Fails to adhere to an enrollment or selection process that provides equal opportunity to all students without regard to racial and socioeconomic status.
 - (d) Prior to nonrenewing or revoking a charter, a local board of education shall hold a hearing on any issues in controversy. A spokesperson for the charter school shall be

provided an opportunity to present information refuting the basis upon which the nonrenewal or revocation is premised. At least 30 days' notice shall be provided to representatives of 3 the charter school before the hearing. Within 60 days after the hearing, the local board of education shall announce its 5 6 decision regarding the nonrenewal or revocation issue. The 7 board may abandon the proposed nonrenewal or revocation, nonrenew or revoke the charter, or continue recognition of the 8 charter contingent upon compliance with specified conditions. 9 10 The decision of a local board of education to nonrenew or revoke a charter shall be made in writing to the charter 11 12 school and shall specify the reasons for the nonrenewal or revocation. The decision of the local board of education is 13 14 not subject to appeal. The charter school may repetition the 15 local board for authority to operate a charter school, or within 30 days after the decision, the charter school may 16 17 submit a written request to the board of education for the reconsideration of its decision and may submit an amended 18 petition with the request for reconsideration. The board shall 19 act on the request within 30 days after the request for 20 21 reconsideration is received by the board. 22

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Section 7. The local board of education of the school system in which a charter school is being operated may provide transportation for students to and from the charter school.

Section 8. (a) An employee who is participating in the operation of a charter school, who otherwise qualifies for membership in the Retirement Systems of Alabama, may be a member of the system.

(b) An employee who is participating in the operation of a charter school, who otherwise qualifies for health insurance and other fringe benefit programs provided through the Alabama Public Education Employee Health Insurance Program, may be eligible to participate in those programs.

Section 9. (a) The State Board of Education, upon request, shall provide any school building or school system employee group, educational services contractor, or any other person or entity with technical advice and assistance regarding the establishment and operation of a charter school or the preparation of a petition requesting authorization from a local board of education to establish and operate a charter school.

(b) At the conclusion of each school year in which a charter school is operated in a school system, the local board of education shall evaluate the impact the charter school has had on the local educational system and shall submit the evaluation to the State Board of Education. If applicable, the evaluation shall include a statement regarding the reasons why a charter school was discontinued or did not seek renewal and whether the program shall continue as a non-charter school. The State Board of Education shall review, assess, and compile the evaluations of charter schools submitted by all local boards of education in the state and shall submit the compilation of evaluations and other relevant material to the

Governor and the Legislature on or before the fifth
legislative day of each regular session.

Section 10. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
