1 To amend Sections 22-50-1 and 22-50-17, Code of 2 Alabama 1975, relating to the care or treatment of mental or emotional illness or intellectual disability; to define the 3 term Mental Illness or Substance Abuse Treatment; to exempt a physician, psychiatrist, psychologist, social worker or 5 Christian Science practitioner from the requirement that he or 6 7 she be certified or licensed under certain circumstances; and to exempt a church or ministry which provides only religious 8 9 services.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 22-50-1 and 22-50-17, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

"For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by this section:

- "(1) MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES. Diagnosis of, treatment of, rehabilitation for, follow-up care of, prevention of and research into the causes of all forms of mental or emotional illness, including, but not limited to, alcoholism, drug addiction, or epilepsy in combination with mental illness or mental retardation.
- "(2) MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES. Evaluation for, amelioration of, habilitation for, prevention of, and research into the causes of mental retardation.
- "(3) PATIENTS. Those persons afflicted with mental or emotional illness.

- "(4) CLIENTS. Those persons identified as receiving or needing services for mental retardation.
- 3 "(5) DEPARTMENT. The Department of Mental Health and
 4 Mental Retardation.

"(6) MENTAL ILLNESS OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT.

The application of professionally planned, managed,
administered, or monitored clinical procedures or
evidenced-based interventions to identify, stabilize,
minimize, or alleviate the harmful consequences of substance
related or mental or emotional disorders, and to restore
impaired health and functionality relative to such.

"No person, partnership, corporation, or association of persons shall operate a facility or institution for the care or treatment of any kind of mental or emotional illness or services to the mentally retarded as defined in this chapter, without being certified by the department or licensed by the State Board of Health; provided that nothing in this section shall be construed so as to require certification or a license for a duly authorized physician, psychiatrist, psychologist, social worker or Christian Science practitioner to obtain a license for treatment of patients in his private office, unless he keeps two or more patients in his office for continuous periods of 24 hours or more in one week or a church or ministry which provides only religious services."

Section 2. No part of this act shall be construed as a mandate for an insurance policy, plan, or contract to offer

or provide new or additional coverage benefits, or require any payment or prepayment to any person by any insurer or health care service plan.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
