Tuscaloosa, the first Black radio station in Alabama, among numerous other enterprises; and

WHEREAS, in the late 1970s, the Rosemores founded Pro-Med Capital, which merged with a sister company and is now PMC Commercial Trust (PCC), listed on the New York Stock Exchange; among the company's specialties are loans helping people set up in business; and

WHEREAS, the Rosemores lived most of their life together in Fayette, rearing their family of five children in Alabama and personifying the values of family and community while emphasizing the transcendent importance of a good education; and

WHEREAS, no measure of merit may be detracted from the standing of Mrs. Rosemore by the fact that she is the mother-in-law of our friend and colleague, Representative Johnny Mack Morrow; now therefore,
