8	MOURNING THE DEATH OF MR. JOHN PAUL SINGLETON.

10	WHEREAS, with an overwhelming sense of loss, we
11	receive news of the death of Mr. John Paul Singleton of Holt,
12	Alabama, on April 15, 2011, at the age of 101 years; and
13	WHEREAS, Mr. Singleton was a prominent businessman
14	and civic leader whose community service included guiding the
15	Tuscaloosa area through difficult times; he was president of
16	the Tuscaloosa Board of Education when schools were integrated
17	and was a calming voice of reason in the turbulent era; and
18	WHEREAS, born in Washington County, Alabama, on
19	September 13, 1909, he arrived in Tuscaloosa in 1929 to look
20	for work during the Great Depression and found a job as a
21	clerk at the old Central Foundry, then one of the city's
22	largest industries; through the years, he rose steadily
23	through the ranks and retired as president of the company in
24	the early 1980s; and
25	WHEREAS, among his well-deserved awards and honors,
26	he was named Tuscaloosa Citizen of the Year in 1957, Pillar of
27	West Alabama in 2005, and was inducted into the Tuscaloosa

County Civic Hall of Fame in 2008; his community leadership
included heading the United Fund (now United Way) and serving
as president of the Rotary Club and the Boy Scouts Black
Warrior Council; he also served faithfully on the deacon board
of Holt Baptist Church; and

WHEREAS, preceding him in death were his beloved wife of almost 70 years, Nell Murphy Singleton, and son, Paul Singleton, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, he is survived by his sons, Jim Singleton and David Singleton; eight grandchildren; 13 great-grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Singleton was a selfless and humble man who loved his family, friends, church, employees, and community; he will also be remembered for the indomitable spirit that kept him active even in his 90s, greeting visitors with enthusiasm, driving his own car, fishing for crappie, and even walking on a glacier in Alaska; and

WHEREAS, above all, Mr. Singleton was motivated by an unwavering commitment to be of service to others; he believed in judging people by their character and nothing else, and he lived his belief every day; few individuals have equaled the impact of his contributions to the community, and his legacy will endure for future generations; now therefore,
