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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under Section 17-16-4, Code of Alabama 1975,
9		the state reimburses counties for all sums expended
10		by the counties in payment of expenses incurred in
11		holding and conducting an election in which only
12		candidates for federal or state office are
13		nominated or elected. Section 17-16-2 of the Code
14		of Alabama 1975, defines these reimbursable
15		expenses to include such items as the costs of
16		ballots, supplies, and materials furnished to
17		election officials, the per diem and mileage
18		provided to election officials, and the cost of
19		preparing and furnishing lists of qualified
20		electors. The list of reimbursable expenses does
21		not include the cost of publication or postage.
22		This bill would include these expenses in
23		the list of election expenses reimbursable by the
24		state.
25		This bill would create an Election Expense
26		Reimbursement Committee to identify other expenses

which shall be eligible for reimbursement.

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. Sections 17-16-2 and 17-16-4, Code of
14	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
15	" §17-16-2.
16	"As used in this chapter, the term "expenses" shall
17	include the following items, and $\frac{1}{100}$ and $\frac{1}{100}$ and $\frac{1}{100}$ other items
18	approved as reimbursable expenses by the Election Expense
19	Reimbursement Committee pursuant to Section 17-16-2.1:
20	"(1) The per diem compensation and mileage provided
21	by law for election officials.
22	"(2) The per diem compensation provided by law for
23	the clerk or other official acting in his or her stead for
24	handling absentee ballots as absentee election manager.
25	"(3) The costs of ballots, supplies, and other
26	materials or equipment necessary for election officials to
27	conduct elections as required by law to be furnished to

election officials and <u>as</u> certified by the judge of probate as

chief election official of the county. In those counties where

electronic voting machines are used, such voting equipment

shall not be considered as ballots, supplies, or materials, as

herein used.

- "(4) The costs of absentee ballots, supplies, postage, and other materials required by law to be furnished to the official handling absentee ballots absentee election manager.
- "(5) The cost of preparing and furnishing the lists of qualified electors to the election officials as required by law.
- "(6) The cost of publishing any notice or other item related to any election and required by law, including, but not limited to, the publication of notice of any election and any voter lists.

"The State of Alabama shall reimburse a county for all sums expended by the county in payment of expenses <u>as</u>

provided for in Sections 17-16-2 and 17-16-2.1 and incurred in holding and conducting an election in which only candidates for federal or state offices are nominated or federal or state officials are elected. For the purposes of this section, a candidate for federal or state office includes a candidate seeking election as a district representative for a federal or state office appearing on the ballot in any portion of a county."

Section 2. The following new Section 17-16-2.1 is added to Title 17, Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

\$17-16-2.1.

- (a) There is hereby established an Election Expense Reimbursement Committee designated to identify any election costs not included in Section 17-16-2, which costs shall be included as a reimbursable election expense under this chapter. The committee shall consist of the following:
 - (1) The President Pro Tempore of the Alabama Senate.
- (2) The Speaker of the Alabama House of Representatives.

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- (3) The Secretary of State or his or her designee.
- (4) The Director of Finance or his or her designee.
- (5) The chair of the Senate Constitution, Campaign Finance, Ethics and Election Committee or its successor committee.
- (6) The chair of the House Constitution, Campaign and Elections Committee or its successor committee.
- (7) The chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee or its successor committee.
- (8) The chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee or its successor committee.
- (b) The committee shall meet not less than 90 days prior to the state primary set for June 2012 to develop and approve the list of reimbursable expenses for the upcoming election cycle. After the list has been approved by the committee, it shall be forwarded to the Comptroller's office.

The Comptroller shall distribute the list to the chair of each county commission and each probate judge in the state no later than 60 days prior to the date of the primary. The list of approved expenses shall apply in all elections and remain in effect until and unless amended by the committee at least 90 days prior to the primary in a subsequent election cycle.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
