17	To amend Section 41-9-870, Code of Alabama 1975,
18	relating to the Alabama Peace Officers Hall of Fame; to
19	provide further for membership requirements, terms of office,
20	diversity of membership, and selection of a chair each two
21	years.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 41-9-870 of the Code of Alabama
24	1975, is amended to read as follows:
25	"§41-9-870.
26	"(a) The Alabama Peace Officers' Hall of Fame Board
27	is hereby created and established. The board shall be composed

1 of seven law enforcement officers, no two of whom shall be 2 from the same congressional district, elected for a term of four years by the board itself. Board members shall be 3 prohibited from serving consecutive terms. The Each two years 5 the board shall annually elect one of the members to serve as chairman chair. The initial board members shall be appointed 6 7 as follows, viz: The member from Congressional District No. 1 One member shall be appointed by from the Alabama Peace 8 9 Officers' Association; the member from Congressional District No. 2 one member shall be appointed by from the Alabama 10 Sheriffs' Association; the member from Congressional District 11 12 No. 3 one member shall be appointed by from the Fraternal 13 Order of Police; the member from Congressional District No. 4 14 one member shall be appointed by from the Alabama League of 15 Municipalities; the member from Congressional District No. 5 16 one member shall be appointed by from the Alabama Association 17 of County Commissioners; the member from Congressional District No. 6 one member shall be appointed by the Alabama 18 Association of Chiefs of Police; and the member from 19 Congressional District No. 7 one member shall be appointed by 20 21 from the Alabama State Troopers Association. Members of the 22 board shall not be compensated for their services. The board 23 shall meet annually at the office of the Alabama Peace 24 Officers' Association, and or at such other times and places 25 as its rules and bylaws may prescribe. A majority of the 26 members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of 27 business.

1	"(b) The membership of the board shall be inclusive
2	and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and
3	economic diversity of the state. The board shall annually
4	report to the Legislature by the second legislative day of
5	each regular session the extent to which the board has
6	complied with the diversity provisions provided for in this
7	act."
8	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
9	first day of the third month following its passage and
10	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
