1	Section 1. Section 15-5-1, Code of Alabama 1975, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§15-5-1.
4	" <u>(a)</u> A "search warrant" is an order in writing in
5	the name of the state signed by a justice, judge, or by a
6	magistrate authorized by law to issue search warrants, and
7	directed to the sheriff or to any constable of the county,
8	commanding him or her to search for personal property and
9	bring it before the court issuing the warrant.
10	"(b) A search warrant authorized by law may be
11	issued by any of the following:
12	"(1) A magistrate who is authorized to practice law
13	in this state.
14	"(2) A municipal judge, if the search is to be
15	conducted within the police jurisdiction of the municipality.
16	"(3) A district judge within the county.
17	"(4) A circuit judge within the judge's circuit.
18	"(5) An appellate judge."
19	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
20	first day of the third month following its passage and
21	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
