8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the Alabama Film Office
9 exists as a separate agency of state government.

10 This bill would abolish the Alabama Film
11 Office and transfer all of the equipment, duties,
12 functions, and funds of the Alabama Film Office to
13 the Alabama Development Office. This bill would
14 provide that all references to the Alabama Film
15 Office would be references to the Alabama
16 Development Office. This bill would provide that
17 any employees of the Department of Tourism who were
18 performing the functions of the Alabama Film Office
19 would remain employees of the Department of
20 Tourism.

22 A BILL

23 TO BE ENTITLED

24 AN ACT

26 Relating to the Alabama Film Office; to repeal
27 Sections 41-7A-1 to 41-7A-3, inclusive, Code of Alabama 1975;

1 to abolish the Alabama Film Office; to transfer the equipment,
2 records, supplies, and all duties, functions, funds, and
3 appropriations of the film office to the Alabama Development
4 Office; and to provide for any employees of the Department of
5 Tourism who were performing the functions of the Alabama Film
6 Office would remain employees of the Department of Tourism.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. Sections 41-7A-1 to 41-7A-3, inclusive,
9 Code of Alabama 1975, are repealed.

10 Section 2. (a) The Alabama Film Office is abolished.
11 All equipment, records, and supplies and the duties,
12 functions, and funds of and appropriations to the Alabama Film
13 Office are confirmed, continued, transferred to, and vested in
14 the Alabama Development Office.

15 (b) All references in the Code of Alabama 1975 to
16 the Alabama Film Office are deemed references to the Alabama
17 Development Office.

18 (c) Any employees of the Department of Tourism
19 performing any functions and duties of the Alabama Film Office
20 on the effective date of this act shall remain employees of
21 the Department of Tourism.

22 Section 3. This act shall become effective on
23 October 1, 2011.
