23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The Alabama PK-20 Leadership Council is
25	created.
26	Section 2. (a) The council is charged with
27	developing and recommending proposals to improve the quality

and effectiveness of education throughout the State of

Alabama, to establish benchmarks to demonstrate progress, and

to promote the commitment of the council to success. To

accomplish these goals, the council shall focus on the

following three primary purposes:

- (1) To bridge the gap between academic expectations in the state for all high school graduates by addressing continuity between what students are expected to learn in PK-12 and what students must know to be prepared to succeed in postsecondary institutions and in a career.
- (2) To promote effective strategies for preparing students for college or work, with an emphasis on math and science, communication skills, technical education programs, teacher education programs, and professional development.
- (3) To advocate for integrated PK-20 initiatives designed to increase student aspirations and expectations for success in achieving high academic standards and for making dreams of an education beyond high school come true.
- (b) To achieve the purposes specified in subsection
  (a), the council shall consider, but not be limited to, all of the following objectives:
- (1) Quality performance standards to help reduce the need for remediation.
- (2) Public awareness of the importance of improved success based on preparation and ability.
- (3) Curricular and assessment alignment throughout all levels of education.

- 1 (4) Performance indicators that monitor progress in 2 improving teaching quality and increasing student achievement.
- 3 (5) Increasing participation and success of minority 4 students.

Section 3. (a) The Alabama PK-20 Leadership Council shall be composed of representatives of education, state government, and business. By virtue of position, the State Superintendent of Education, a university president selected by the four-year presidents serving on the council at the time, and the Chancellor of the Department of Postsecondary Education shall rotate as chair of the council. In addition, a member of the council shall be elected at large to serve in the rotation every fourth cycle. The State Superintendent of Education shall serve as the initial chair of the council. A vice chair shall be elected at large to serve a concurrent two-year term with the chair. Appointed members of the council may serve no more than two consecutive two-year terms.

- (b) The membership of the council shall include all of the following:
  - (1) Nine members representing K-12 including:
  - a. The State Superintendent of Education.
- b. Two members appointed by the Alabama Association of School Boards.
  - c. Two members appointed by the School Superintendents of Alabama.
- d. Two members appointed by the Alabama Education
  Association.

- 1 e. Two members appointed by the Council of Leaders 2 in Alabama Schools. (2) Four members representing two-year colleges 3 including: a. The Chancellor of the Department of Postsecondary 5 Education. 6 7 b. Three members appointed by the Chancellor from the two-year college system. 8 (3) Five members representing four-year 9 10 universities: a. The President of Auburn University. 11 12 b. (c) Individuals representing the Alabama business community, appointed pursuant to paragraphs 1. and m. of subsection (b), may serve for no more than two terms of two years each.

Section 4. (a) An executive committee for the PK-20 Leadership Council is established. The chair of the executive committee shall be the council chair. The membership of the executive committee shall include all of the following:

- (1) The State Superintendent of Education.
- (2) The Chancellor of the State Department of Postsecondary Education.
  - (3) The President of Auburn University.
- 17 (4) The Chancellor of the University of Alabama
  18 System.
  - (5) Five members of the council. Two of whom shall be selected by the State Superintendent of Education, two of whom shall be selected by the entire membership of the council, and one of whom shall be selected by the university presidents serving on the council.
    - (6) Three ex officio, nonvoting members as follows:
  - a. The Governor, or his or her designee.
    - b. The Vice President of the State Board of Education.

1 c. The Executive Director of the Alabama Commission 2 on Higher Education.

(b) The executive committee shall meet as determined by the chair of the executive committee. A simple majority of the membership of the executive committee shall constitute a quorum. Initially, members of the executive committee shall provide the primary staff support necessary for the business of the council.

Section 5. The council shall meet at least three times a year and shall provide a progress report to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, the State Board of Education, and each public university board of trustees.

Section 6. Each member of the council may designate a representative to attend council meetings in his or her absence. The representative shall hold the proxy of the member for both discussions and casting votes related to action items of the council.

Section 7. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
