11	WHEREAS, in honor of the late Philip Mahan Davis, a
12	Pelham law enforcement officer who was killed in the line of
13	duty, it is benefitting to name that portion of I-65 North
14	between mile marker 234 north to the Shelby/Jefferson County
15	line the Philip M. Davis Highway; and
16	WHEREAS, Philip M. Davis graduated from the Alabama
17	Criminal Justice Training Center in 1998, received his
18	bachelor's degree in criminal justice from The University of
19	Alabama in 2000, and his master's degree from Faulkner State
20	College in 2005; and
21	WHEREAS, Officer Davis was born on January 7, 1976,
22	and served with the Calera Police Department before joining
23	the Pelham Police Department in 2005; he was a true hero who
24	cared deeply for his family, friends, co-workers, community,
25	and nation; and
26	WHEREAS, Officer Davis, who was fatally shot during
27	a routine traffic stop on I-65 North, was the first Pelham

officer to die in the line of duty in the department's 45-year history; he left a wife, Paula, and two children, Sarah and John; and

WHEREAS, on September 29, 2010, Officer Davis posthumously received the Officer of the Year Award; in making this award, Pelham Police Chief Tommy Thomas noted that Officer Davis sacrificed all of his tomorrows to give us safety today and that Officer Davis was honored as a hero, not because he died or how he died, but because of what he did when he was alive; and

WHEREAS, Officer Davis, who was known for his professionalism and work ethic, was well-respected, easy to get along with, and possessed a tremendous sense of humor; and

WHEREAS, the Officer of the Year Award recognizes
Officer Davis's dedicated service to the citizens of Alabama
and his legacy as a law enforcement officer, a husband and
father, and a friend of all Alabama citizens; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That in honor and memory of the late Officer Philip M. Davis, we declare that portion of I-65 beginning at mile marker 234 and continuing north to the Shelby/Jefferson County line be named the Philip M. Davis Highway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the appropriate officials be requested to place and maintain appropriate signs or markers as provided in this resolution.
