8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF DR. HENRY THOMAS SCOTT, JR.

10 WHEREAS, with profound sorrow and regret, we receive  
11 news of the death of Dr. Henry Thomas Scott, Jr., of  
12 Inverness, Alabama, on August 2, 2010; and

13 WHEREAS, a native of Houston, Texas, he moved to  
14 Birmingham at an early age and graduated from Woodlawn High  
15 School prior to enlisting in the United States Navy, where he  
16 was assigned to communication and armament in Manila Bay and  
17 served with honor and distinction; and

18 WHEREAS, he earned his undergraduate degree from  
19 Samford University and his professional degree from Palmer  
20 College of Chiropractic in Davenport, Iowa, in 1951; and

21 WHEREAS, Dr. Scott was instrumental in getting the  
22 state's Chiropractic Law passed on January 1, 1959, and held  
23 Alabama License #6 from the Alabama State Board of  
24 Chiropractic Examiners; and

25 WHEREAS, among his roles of professional leadership,  
26 he served as president of the Alabama State Board of  
27 Chiropractic Examiners three times, president of the Alabama

1 State Chiropractic Association for two terms, and was an  
2 active member of the American Chiropractic Association, Palmer  
3 CIAA, and the Federation of Chiropractic Examiners Board; and

4 WHEREAS, he was named Chiropractor of the Year 1962  
5 and honored as 2003 Lifetime Achiever in the Alabama  
6 Chiropractic Hall of Fame; through the years, Dr. Scott was a  
7 mentor and source of wisdom for many young chiropractors; and

8 WHEREAS, devoted to family and faith, he was an  
9 18-year member of Vestavia Hills Church of Christ; and

10 WHEREAS, he is survived by his loving wife of 54  
11 years, Evelyn Harris Scott; daughter, Linda Waldrop; two sons,  
12 John Scott and Tommy Scott; seven grandchildren; and a  
13 brother, Ralph Scott; and

14 WHEREAS, preceding him in death were his beloved  
15 parents, Henry and Louise Scott, and brother, James Scott; and

16 WHEREAS, Dr. Scott was a devout Christian and an  
17 enthusiastic positive motivator who promoted the good inside  
18 each individual he encountered; his strength, endurance, and  
19 quest for life were examples he taught to many and relayed to  
20 his cherished family; now therefore,

21 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH  
22 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the death of Dr. Henry Thomas  
23 Scott, Jr., is recorded with deep sadness, and this resolution  
24 is offered in highest tribute to his life, along with  
25 heartfelt sympathy to his grieving family.
