8 SYNOPSIS: In the fiscal year 2009-2010 there were
9 1,603 National Board Certified teachers in Alabama.
10 Currently, in the fiscal year 2011-2012 there are
11 1,848 National Board Certified teachers in Alabama.

12 This bill would make a supplemental
13 appropriation in the amount of \$2,233,700 from the
14 Education Trust Fund to the State Department of
15 Education for the fiscal year ending September 30,
16 2012, to pay the entire \$5,000 salary supplement
17 for the fiscal years 2009-2010 and 2011-2012 to
18 teachers who completed the process to become
19 certified by the National Board of Professional
20 Teaching Standards.

26 To make a supplemental appropriation in the amount
27 of \$2,233,700 from the Education Trust Fund to the State

1 Department of Education for the fiscal year ending September
2 30, 2012, to pay the entire \$5,000 salary supplement to
3 teachers for the fiscal years 2009-2010 and 2011-2012 who
4 complete the process to become certified by the National Board
5 of Professional Teaching Standards.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated two million
8 two hundred thirty-three thousand seven hundred dollars
9 (\$2,233,700) from the Education Trust Fund to the State
10 Department of Education to ensure that for the fiscal years
11 2009-2010 and 2011-2012 the entire five thousand dollar
12 (\$5,000) salary supplement to teachers who complete the
13 process to become certified by the National Board of
14 Professional Teaching Standards be paid in the fiscal year
15 ending September 30, 2012.

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective
17 immediately following its passage and approval by the
18 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
