16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. (a) No inmate in the custody of the
18	Department of Corrections or city and county jails shall
19	establish or maintain an account on any Internet-based social
20	networking website.
21	(b) For purposes of this act, social networking
22	website means an Internet-based website that has any of the
23	following capabilities:
24	(1) Allows users to create web pages or profiles
25	about themselves that are available to the general public or
26	to any other users.

1 (2) Offers a mechanism for communication among
2 users, such as a forum, chat room, electronic mail, or instant
3 messaging.

(c) Any inmate <u>or other persons working in</u>

<u>conjunction with a state correction's inmate</u> who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500).

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
