27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The Director of Transportation may appoint up to three deputy directors of transportation, one of whom may be the chief engineer, with the approval of the Governor. The Director of Transportation may assign duties and responsibilities to a deputy director as may be necessary for the proper administration and execution of the work of the Department of Transportation. The salary of a deputy director shall be determined by the Director of Transportation, with the approval of the Governor. A deputy director shall be paid from funds of the department in the same manner as salaries and expenses of other department employees are paid. A deputy director shall give bond for the faithful performance of his or her duties in an amount approved by the director.

(b) A deputy director appointed pursuant to this section shall serve at the pleasure of the Director of Transportation and shall not be subject to the state Merit System law, but shall otherwise be considered a state employee for all other purposes.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
