The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

TO BE ENTITLED

11 AN ACT

To create the crime of possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute; criminal penalties; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) A person commits the crime of unlawful possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance if, except as otherwise authorized by law, he or she possesses with intent to sell, furnish, give away, deliver, or distribute a controlled substance enumerated in Schedules I through V.

1 (b) Unlawful possession with intent to distribute 2 controlled substances is a Class B felony.

- (c) With regard to the following controlled substances, possession of the following quantities shall be prima facie evidence of a person's intent to sell, furnish, give away, deliver, or distribute the controlled substance:
- (1) More than five grams, but less than 28 grams, of cocaine or of any mixture containing cocaine.
- (2) More than one gram, but less than four grams of any morphine, opium, or any salt, isomer, or salt of an isomer thereof, including heroin.
- (3) More than five grams, but less than 28 grams, of 3,4-methylenedioxy amphetamine, or of any mixture containing 3,4-methylenedioxy amphetamine.
- (4) More than five grams, but less than 28 grams, of 5-methoxy-3, 4-methylenedioxy amphetamine, or of any mixture containing 5-methoxy-3, 4-methylenedioxy amphetamine.
- (5) More than five grams, but less than 28 grams, of amphetamine or any mixture containing amphetamine, its salt, optical isomer, or salt of its optical isomer thereof.
- (6) More than five grams, but less than 28 grams, of methamphetamine or any mixture containing methamphetamine, its salts, optical isomers, or salt of its optical isomers thereof.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further

requirements and application under Amendment 621, now
appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of
the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the
bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an
existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
