13	to further provide for the qualifications and duties of the

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Sections 23-1-22, 23-1-23, and 23-1-24 of
17	the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
18	"§23-1-22.
19	"(a) There is hereby created within the State
20	Department of Transportation the position of chief engineer,
21	which shall be filled by appointment by the Director of
22	Transportation, with the approval of the Governor. Such
23	appointment shall also be subject to approval by the State
24	Board of Registration for Engineers and Land Surveyors. The
25	salary of the chief engineer shall be as determined pursuant
26	to Chapter 6 of Title 36 by the director with approval of the
27	Governor, and he the chief engineer shall be allowed traveling

expenses when traveling on business of the state pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 36, all to be paid from funds of the State Department of Transportation as salaries and expenses of other State Department of Transportation employees are paid. The chief engineer shall give bond for the faithful performance of his <u>or her</u> duties in an amount to be approved by the Governor.

"(b) The chief engineer shall serve <u>at the pleasure</u> of and under the direction of the Director of Transportation and otherwise be entitled to all the privileges and responsibilities as other Merit System employees, and his service and removal and shall be subject to the <u>an exempt</u> employee under the state Merit System regulations.

"§23-1-23.

"The chief engineer shall be a registered licensed professional engineer in the State of Alabama with a minimum of 15 years' progressive professional engineering experience pertaining to the planning, development, construction, maintenance, and repair of highways and bridges. He The chief engineer shall either hold a degree in civil engineering from an accredited school of engineering or shall have served at least ten (10) years as a Division Engineer or Bureau Chief with the Department of Transportation school of recognized standing. The chief engineer and shall have a detail possess a detailed knowledge of engineering principles and their application pertaining to highways and bridges. He The chief engineer shall maintain citizenship in the State of Alabama be

1 a citizen of this state and shall continuously be a registered 2 licensed professional engineer in the State of Alabama as a condition while serving in this office this state while 3 employed.

"\$23-1-24.

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"The duties of the chief engineer in the State Department of Transportation shall include the administration of technical phases of the organization, and direction and coordination of the engineering activities of the State Department of Transportation. The chief engineer of the State Department of Transportation shall coordinate the general mathematical, physical, and engineering sciences as applied to the planning, design, construction, maintenance, or repair of highways and bridges in this state. The Director of Transportation may assign general engineering, administrative, and operational activities to other qualified employees of the department. The chief engineer shall affix his signature to sign the title sheets of all plans let to contract by the State Department of Transportation department. The duties of the chief engineer shall be subject to and under the direction, control, and supervision of the Director of Transportation."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
