Section 1. (a) Commencing on the effective date of this act, any new contract awarded for the construction of a new building, containing classrooms or dorm rooms, on the grounds of a public two-year or four-year institution of higher education shall include an Alabama Building Commission approved safe space or hallway.

- (b) The State Department of Postsecondary Education and the separate boards of trustees of the four-year institutions of higher education in the state shall coordinate with the Alabama Building Commission to develop, promulgate, and enforce any rules necessary for the implementation of this section.
- (c) It is the intent of the Legislature that constitutionally created boards of trustees comply with the requirements of this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
