13 Relating to Mobile County; to authorize the Mobile
14 County Commission to impose an additional issuance fee in the
15 Office of the License Commissioner; and to provide for the use
16 of the proceeds from the issuance fee for the upgrading and
17 maintaining of records, equipment, and technology within the
18 Office of the License Commissioner.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

20 Section 1. (a) In Mobile County, the Mobile County
21 Commission, by resolution of the commission adopted at
22 regularly scheduled meetings, may impose a special issuance
23 fee not to exceed five dollars (\$5) to be collected by the
24 license commissioner on each motor vehicle registration, boat
25 renewal or registration, manufactured home registration,
26 business license application, or other instrument registered
27 or application applied for in the Office of the License

1 Commissioner. The special issuance fee shall be in addition to
2 all other fees, taxes, and other charges provided by law.

3 (b) The issuance fees collected pursuant to this act
4 shall be deposited in a segregated account of the Office of
5 the License Commissioner and expended by the license
6 commissioner for the preservation and storage of motor vehicle
7 registration, boat registration, and business licenses as
8 prescribed by the State Examiners of Public Accounts and for
9 the purchase, installation, improvement, development,
10 upgrading, and maintenance of equipment and technology in the
11 Office of the License Commissioner of Mobile County.

12 Section 2. This act is cumulative and shall not
13 alter or change any existing law relating to charges and fees
14 collected by the License Commissioner of Mobile County.

15 Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
16 with this act are repealed.

17 Section 4. This act shall become effective
18 immediately following its passage and approval by the
19 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
