DONALD RAY MINCHER. 8 9 10 WHEREAS, with profound sorrow and regret, we receive news of the death of Mr. Donald Ray Mincher of Huntsville, 11 12 Alabama, on March 4, 2012, at the age of 73 years; and 13 WHEREAS, the passing of Mr. Mincher leaves a void in 14 the lives of his loving family, his many friends, and in the 15 entire community, where he was highly regarded; he was a member of the Mayfair Church of Christ; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Mr. Mincher was a prominent figure in Huntsville baseball for a half century and was crowned in 2010 18 as "King of Baseball," the highest honor in Minor League 19 Baseball; he was unique in the history of the sport because of 20 21 the various roles he held, from player to team owner, to 22 league president; and 23 WHEREAS, he was a standout athlete who played 24 football and baseball at S.R. Butler High School, and was 25 drafted by the Chicago White Sox immediately after his 1956 26 graduation; he played professional baseball until 1972,

playing in the 1965 and 1972 World Series and the 1967 and
 1969 All-Star Games; and

WHEREAS, from 1972-1985, he owned and operated Don
Mincher's All Sports Trophies, and from 1985-2001, he served
as president and general manager of the Huntsville Stars,
followed by his tenure as president of the Southern League,
2001-2011; and

8 WHEREAS, among his honors through the years, he was 9 inducted into the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame in 2008, the 10 same year he won the Warren Giles Award for his service to 11 Minor League Baseball; in addition, the road leading to Joe 12 Davis Stadium was named Don Mincher Drive by the City of 13 Huntsville in 1999; and

14 WHEREAS, survivors include his wife of 56 years, 15 Patsy Ann Payne Mincher; his children and their spouses, Mark 16 (Nancy) Mincher, Donna (Gary) Hopper, and Lori (Doug) Lumpkin; 17 six grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren; he was 18 predeceased by his parents, George and Lillian Mincher; and

19 WHEREAS, Mr. Mincher was a valued member of the 20 community; although his presence will be greatly missed, his 21 memory will be forever treasured in the hearts and minds of 22 those who were fortunate to know him; now therefore,
